Frankie Dennie Fultz was born in Johnson County, Arkansas on February 21, 1921. On February 7, 2018, fourteen days short of her 97th birthday, she departed this life at her son, Keith's home, following a brief illness. She was a member of Pulaski Heights Baptist Church since 1936.

She was preceded in death by her parents, J.T. Williams and Lutie Hanna Williams; husbands, Earl W. Dennie and Edwin Fultz; a son, Dr. Ronald W. Dennie; a daughter, Janice Dennie; granddaughter, April Lynn Dennie; brother, J.T. Williams, Jr.; sister, Lorene Smith; and brother-in-law, James Dennie.

Frankie graduated from Little Rock High School and attended Draughon's Business College. She married Earl William Dennie in March of 1941. To this union, three children were born, Ronald, Keith and Janice. Following Earl's death in Tulsa in October, 1987, she moved back to Little Rock. Frankie's daughter, Janice, was born with Cerebral Palsy. During this time, there were no facilities for the handicapped, so Frankie and many others worked valiantly to open a center where they could learn, play and just be with other children. They were successful in opening a center, and Frankie was honored when a center was named after her, "The Frankie Dennie Center." In 1968, she was named Woman of the Year by the Arkansas Democrat for all her work with the handicapped.
